*A Brief History
of*
THE JOHN PIDDING JONES FAMILY ORGANIZATION
By Eldon A. Jones, Family Genealogist

During the years of 1910 and 1911, the citizens living in Enoch, Iron County, Utah, (who were practically all members of the Jones Family) decided to plan and build a new Church Meeting House. The building consisted of a full basement, entrance hall, and a sizeable auditorium, with a large stage on the east end. This was a very commendable activity for the relatively few people who made up the little town of Enoch.

During the winter of 1910, John Lee Jones, oldest of the John Pidding Jones family, who had always been interested in family genealogy, called his two brothers, Sylvester and Hyrum, and several of his own sons, to a meeting at his home. He explained that by the 10th of June, 1911, they would have the new building completed to a point where they could begin to use the Auditorium and stage. He felt that they should have a community celebration, and inasmuch as he was the oldest and had always been aggressive, he took the lead in calling the group together. John Lee played the violin and he and members of his family for years had furnished the music for local dances which at the time were the main source of amusement and pleasure.

At this meeting it was decided to organize a Jones Family Organization, to be known as The John Pidding Jones Family Organization. John Lee Jones was appointed President of the organization. It was then quickly decided to hold the FIRST Family Reunion on June 10, 1911, this being the birthday of John Pidding Jones.

This first reunion was set up for three days. It was an opportunity for children and members of the family to return home for a visit: and all joined together in having a frolicsome time in meetings, programs, feasting, and then dancing until the wee hours.

For many years thereafter the family reunions were held at Enoch. Later, after the death of the parents, and after the home visits to Enoch had lost some of the charm, they began to hold the annual reunions in other communities where members of the family lived. And these reunions have been held regularly since with a few exceptions such as during the year of the great flu epidemic, and the World War, and on one or two other occasions.

John Lee Jones died 5 Jan 1935, having served as President of the Family Organization for 25 years. After the death of John Lee, Hyrum Jones, my father, and the only surviving son of John Pidding Jones was chosen as President of the organization; he chose Samuel B. Jones as Family Secretary, and the family Organization carried on with some other members of the family serving on a Board of Directors.

I, Eldon Jones, had resided in Spokane, Washington, since 1932, but in the summer of 1937 I was spending a few months with my parents in Enoch,

resting up from an illness. About August 25, as I sat playing the piano, my father, Hyrum Jones came to my side and told me that the previous night at a meeting of the family Board, it had been decided that I should be called to be the Family Genealogist and Researcher, for the John Pidding Jones Family Organization. I accepted the call, and for the past forty years have been working on that assignment. Having tried several different methods and approaches, and not satisfied with results, I finally decided to go to England and do some work on my own. (See Page 489 of the Jones Family Book for details of this mission.)

Hyrum Jones was President of the John Pidding Jones Family Organization from 1935 to 1941, when he passed away. Samuel B. Jones was then appointed President, he being the first to act in this position who was not a son of John Pidding Jones, but a grandson. He retained the same members of the Board as had served under Hyrum, and was active in the position in trying to promote the Organization. The great war of the Forties, with Japan, hindered the work bringing it almost to a standstill for a year or two. Still, Sam B. pushed the work ahead and arranged for annual reunions whenever possible, in which some great and stimulating programs were presented.

At the Reunion held 15 June 1954, at Enterprise, Utah, Samuel B. Jones was released as President because of ill health. Many of those present made remarks of appreciation for his faithful devotion and accomplishments. In the business meeting held at that reunion, Seth M. Jones was appointed President of the Family Organization. It was decided that the new president should name the members of the Board of Directors. There were about 300 present at this reunion. A fine program was presented in which Eldon Jones gave the same prognostication of family future and affairs as he had given at the reunion held in 1916 some 38 years before. Eldon A. Jones was also chosen as family representative.

Subsequent to the reunion at Enterprise, a meeting was held at Cedar City, Utah 8 August 1954 at which the following officers were named by the President: Seth M. Jones, President; Vernon A. Jones, 1st Vice President; Hazel Granger, 2nd Vice President; Eldon A. Jones, Family Genealogist; James S. Jones, Temple Representative; and the following to serve on the Board: George W. Jones, Frank Dalley, Blanch Houchen, Violet Wood, Clara Nielson and LaVon Jones. At this meeting, which was held in the Cedar Second Ward Chapel, Samuel B. Jones turned all of the family records over to Seth M. Jones.

Seth M. Jones made it a point to hold meetings in various places where contact could be made with family members; and he managed to take most members of the Board with him on these visits. The next meeting was held 29 August 1954 at Pleasant Grove, Utah. President Seth reported on the wonderful reunion held at Enterprise, Utah, June 15

and 16, and encouraged those present to enter into the Spirit of the program and that all descendants of John Pidding Jones join in the great Family organization. Several members of the Board expressed themselves regarding the program. It was reported that there were about 450 families in the organization.

A meeting was held in Monticello, Utah, 6 Nov. 1954 for family members in that area, most of them being descendants of "Uncle Freddie" (Frederick Isaac Jones) of which 21 descendants of Uncle Freddie were present. There were nine in the visiting group consisting of President Seth M. Jones and members of the Board. The wonderful reunion held in the spring at Enterprise was reported, and a most enjoyable and spiritual time was held.

On December 15, 1954, another meeting was held at Enterprise, Utah, attended by the President and members of the Board, and by local family members. The visitors reported on the several meetings which had been held during the summer and fall with various family groups, and what a wonderful time had been had. It was decided that this idea was a good one and should be continued.

The next Reunion of the John Pidding Jones Family was held at Enoch 28 May 1955. It was well attended and a spiritual and enjoyable time was had.

At the Reunion held at Enoch, Utah, 12 July 1958, President Seth M. Jones expressed a desire to be released as president of the organization. For the past few years he had been traveling at a fast pace, in holding family meetings, and his health was not good. His wish was granted and he was released with many expressions of gratitude for the fine and devoted work he had done. Vernon A. Jones, who had served as Vice President and Assistant to the President for the past several years, was chosen and elected as the new President of the John Pidding Jones Family Organization. He elected to retain the same persons who had been serving on the Board, and chose his wife, Etta, to become Secretary and Treasurer. Vern was young and had had a lot of experience with Seth and in business and entered into his new assignment with great vigor and enthusiasm. More and more stress was being placed upon each family unit to do their own research work and support the family organization. The first big family reunion under Vern's direction was held at Monticello, Utah 18 June 1960.

The next general John Pidding Jones Family Reunion was held 6 June 1964 at Cedar City, Utah. At this time, Eldon Jones, Family Genealogist, reported that he and his wife, Olive had been called to fill a regular mission in England and that they would leave Salt Lake City 8 July 1964. It was further reported that the Genealogical Society had ceased to do research work for patrons. It was decided that in England, Eldon should attempt to find a researcher to assist him

in working on the family lines.

For the next five years, a great work was done in research in England and elsewhere. President Vern got enthusiastically behind the work, supported by contributions and assistance from family members. For a detailed report of Eldon's research work in England, see Page 489 of the Jones book.

The big project undertaken by Vernon A. Jones and his staff was the accumulation of data and the printing of the John Pidding Jones Family Book. A total of 580 copies of this great book were printed and the majority of them were distributed at the next family reunion which was held on the Brigham Young University campus in the spring of 1972. There was a large attendance and a thrilling experience was had. A detailed report was made of the research in England which Eldon and Elwin had worked on, and which had permitted thousands of names on the family line to be compiled for the book. The officers felt that, in one sense, they might have made a mistake in passing out the books too early in the reunion program, because the people were so engrossed in going through the book that it was difficult to hold their attention with the program.

All our efforts over a hundred years on Genealogical research on the Jones lines, plus some years spent in compiling and printing the book, seemed to peak at this reunion. All our hopes, faith and prayers finally were answered. A solid wall which had existed for forty years on researching our lines had been knocked down. Rejoice and be exceedingly glad that ye are descendants of John Pidding Jones and Margaret Lee, whom the Lord raised up to listen and receive the Gospel. They knew the truth when they heard it and were led to Zion and on to the village of Enoch in southern Utah, where they raised their large family while suffering trials, hardships and tribulations. Now, glory and honor, day by day, is being showered upon them through a fast-growing posterity, who are honest at heart and working for the upbuilding of His Church, Christ our Lord, and those who will be redeemed, and arise in the morn of the First Resurrection as Saints of the Most High God. Blessed be the Name of the Lord.

The John Pidding Jones Reunion was held at Duck Creek, on Cedar Mountain, on the 11th and 12th of June, 1975. On Sunday we attended Sunday School and a Sacrament Meeting conducted for tourists there in the mountains each Sunday during the vacation season. Several families of our group stayed over so as to go fishing on Monday.

Early Moday morning, Vern, Van, his son in-law, and his young grandson, Lloyd, got up early and went fishing. Van was fishing in the stream while Vern and Lloyd were fishing in the lake, next to the highway, where Duck Creek Spring rises. A tragic

accident occurred which was witnessed by a man fishing about 100 yards further along the bank, who later helped to save the life of the driver of a truck involved in the accident. A large semi-truck, pulling a two-wheel trailer, came around a slight bend in the road just above the pond. With his vision somewhat obscured by some willows, and seeing another vehicle pulling out onto the highway, the driver of the semi-truck applied his brakes throwing the vehicle into a skid. It sailed off the highway and into the lake, missing young Lloyd as it went over his head, but hitting Vern as he was sitting at the water's edge, killing him instantly. A father, grand-father and the President of the John Pidding Jones Family Organization was gone! Excitement, amazement and sorrow reigned there for the next several hours.

The tragic accident which happened at Duck Creek on Monday, July 14, 1975 which took the life of Vern Jones, who had served as President of the family organization for fifteen years, left the John Pidding Jones Family disorganized. In the Spring of 1976, letters were coming to me, Eldon Jones, as family Genealogist. There were many inquiries about the possibility of obtaining a copy of the now famous Jones Book, but all copies in the first printing had been sold. Many were writing or coming to see me, to get help with their own family genealogies. I was swamped with work. I decided something should be done to get the organization functioning again, so I took it upon myself to call a meeting. Two, or more representatives of each of the John Pidding Jones children were called to my home for a meeting which was held March 27, 1976. There was a good representation.

After a general discussion and report of what had gone on, it was decided that a family organization should be formed and Lloyd J. Pryor agreed to accept the appointment of Temporary President. ElRoy Jones, who had acted as editor and organizer of the first John Pidding Jones book, had been in touch with the printer of that book. He reported that the plates

used in printing the book were still intact and that the printer had agreed to make a re-print for a reasonable price which would permit the new edition to be sold for \$25 each, the same as for the original edition. It was decided to place an order with the printer for 200 additional copies of the John Pidding Jones Family Book. The printer required an initial deposit of \$2,000 which the group present agreed to meet. These events were reported to family group members in a bulletin sent out by Lloyd J. Pryor and Eldon A. Jones dated April 30, 1976.

Subsequently, Lloyd J. Pryor asked to be relieved of his temporary appointment and then at a meeting of representatives of the family held at the home of Eldon A. Jones in Provo, Utah, 11 Sept. 1976, Elwood Crawford Jones was appointed President of the John Pidding Jones Family Organization. He lives in Moses Lake, Washington. See page 231 in the Family Book for information regarding his family connections. There is much I could say as to his ability and qualifications, but do not have the space. He was authorized to choose a secretary, treasurer, board members, and others in the new organization.

Leland M. Perry, Provo, Utah (see page 297 of the Jones Book) was appointed to up-date all names and current addresses of members of the John Pidding Jones family; and to handle the preparation and mailing of bulletins to family members; and to edit the Errata to be included in the new printing of the Jones Book; and to work with the printer in the second printing of the Jones family book.

Dr. Stanley J. Dalley, Provo, Utah (see page 476 of the Jones book) was appointed as Treasurer and to handle funds of the Jones Family Organization; and to handle orders for copies of the Errata and copies of the new books being printed.

Leland and Stanley have worked closely with Eldon A. Jones, Family Genealogist, in the affairs of the Jones Family Organization during the past two years.

This I know -- it is good to be organized again!

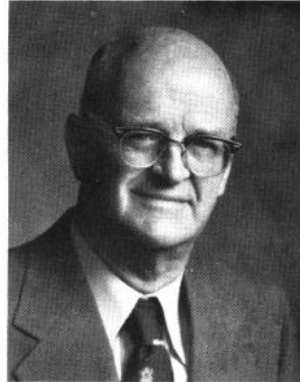

LIFE SKETCH OF DeVAUGHN B. JONES

The community of Monticello, Utah, had only been settled 22 years when I was born on October 29, 1910. Therefore I grew up knowing drinking water came from the irrigation ditch, or that it was hauled in barrels either from Soldier Spring which was approximately three miles southwest of town, or from the community well with its large circular tank that stood high on sturdy legs at a spot where the County Courthouse is now located. Boyhood days were filled with the normal activities of a farming and livestock community, interspersed with horseback camping trips to the mountains, baseball games at evening in the street, and family parties at Grandmother Jones' with her crisp sweet pickles.

Schooling through the twelfth grade became possible as Superintendent H. Lloyd Hansen pushed secondary education in San Juan County and additional physical facilities were added each year to the school building that was located on the corner of 2nd North and Main Street. Our group of nine students, graduating in May of 1928, was the first to finish high school in Monticello. That fall I enrolled at the University of Utah and was there two years.

On October 15, 1931 with three other Elders, one of whom was my cousin Warren F. Bronson, I left Salt Lake City for the California Mission. I was privileged to serve as District President of the San Francisco District and the Nevada District. This was during the depression of the thirties. Elder Alonzo A. Hinckley was the Mission President, succeeding Joseph W. McMurrin. During the latter portion of this mission, missionaries were being released more rapidly than they were coming. President Hinckley arranged with my parents for me to stay an extra six months. It was during this time that most of the San Francisco District was transferred to President Arid W. McDonald of the San Francisco Stake; and the Stake Missionary work was initiated in the Los Angeles area. Also, the auxiliary organizations of the church in the Nevada District were completed on a District basis, preparatory to much of that area being made into a Stake. I was released in April of 1934.

Alene Wood Hansen, daughter of Henry Lloyd Hansen and Catherine Josephine Wood and I were married on October 14, 1935 in the Salt Lake Temple by Elder Alonzo A. Hinckley, who had by this time been ordained an Apostle. We both enrolled at the Utah State Agricultural College in Logan, Utah. We went to school in the winter time and raised turkeys in the summer to help pay school expenses. I graduated in June of 1938, and returned the following year on a teaching fellowship, resigning from this in January of 1939 to work for the Farm Security Administration. Except for six months during the summer and fall of

1939 when I was stationed in Odgen, I spent the next four years in St. George and often was in the Cedar City - Enterprise area and became acquainted with several of our relatives. Alene remained in school and graduated in June of 1939 and that fall accepted a scholarship to the Merrill Palmer School of Child Development in Detroit, Michigan.

After working for the Department of Agriculture for three and one half years we moved back to Monticello, bought a nice little home, and spent the next five years farming, raising turkeys, and helping to look after a small range cattle operation. While in Monticello we were blessed with two lovely children, Catherine Ann and David Lloyd, and learned we were to be blessed with another child. This baby was later born in Salt Lake City on April 6, 1947, and was named Fredric Hansen. In 1946 my father, F. Peter Jones, and I decided to sell most of our property, and in February of 1947 I moved my family to Bountiful, Utah.

We later purchased property in Farmington, county seat of Davis County, and made this our permanent home in April of 1948. I spent 12 years in the retail Mercantile business in Farmington, two years as Executive Secretary of the Davis County Industrial Commission, and then was hired by the Davis County Bank in October, 1962, where I served as a Vice President and loan officer until January of 1976.

After returning from a trip to California one Fall, I learned I had been elected to the Farmington City Council. This began a stint of twelve years on the Council, followed by a turn as Mayor. Because of Church activities at the time, and because of my work at the bank, it became apparent in 1963 that further city responsibility was impossible and so I did not seek re-election. During this time, 1960-1961, I also served as President of the Farmington Lions Club and

appreciated the many friends of that organization.

Alene and I have always enjoyed working in the Church. I have tried always to support her in whatever position she has held. She has always given me the same full-hearted support in all my callings. These have included the Stake Sunday School Board and Stake Superintendency in St. George Stake, the Superintendent of the Monticello Ward Sunday School, and Stake Superintendent of Sunday Schools in the San Juan Stake. After moving to Farmington, I served in both the Ward and Stake Sunday School Superintendency, was first counsellor to Bishop Richard H. Clark in the newly organized Farmington Second Ward from March 27, 1951 to September 29, 1954. On this latter date I was ordained a Bishop by Apostle Matthew Cowley and set apart as the second Bishop of the Farmington Second Ward, Davis Stake. After being released from this position on September 29, 1959, I was set apart as a member of the Davis Stake High Council by Elder Spencer W. Kimball and served under both President Milton J. Hess and Joseph A. Kjar.

At the present time Alene and I are teaching a Family Relations Class in Sunday School in the Farmington Fifth Ward in the Farmington Utah Stake. We are perhaps enjoying this more than any other church assignment, unless it was the two summers we served as stake missionaries at the Cherry Hill Camp Ground here in our Stake and where we met and enjoyed talking with people from all over the United States and many foreign countries.

We have been blessed to have three fine children. The years have sped by and they now have families of their own and live near enough for us to enjoy their companionship.

Life has been good-family heritage, children, friends, and the Church combine to enrich and give meaning and purpose to our lives.

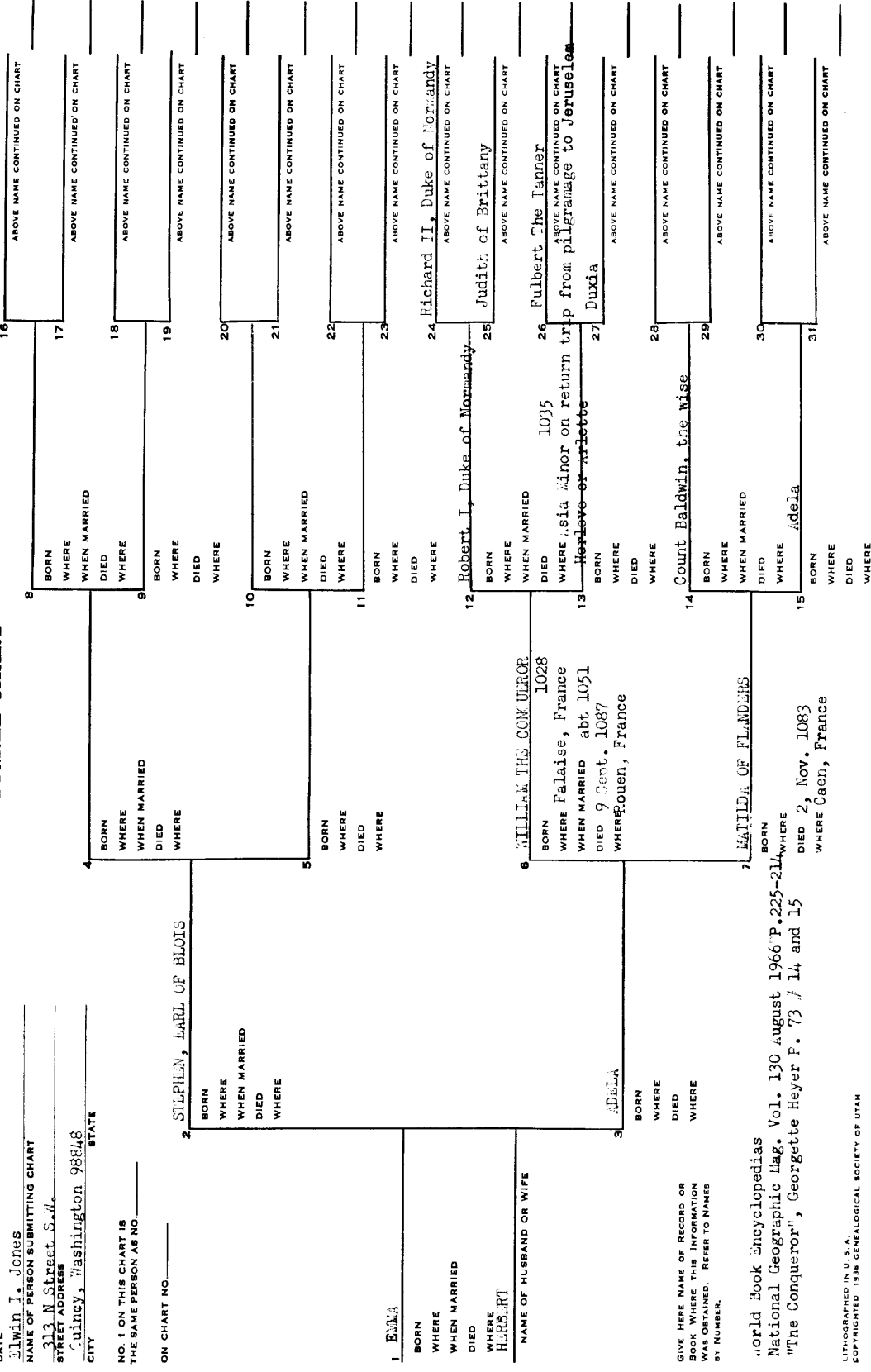

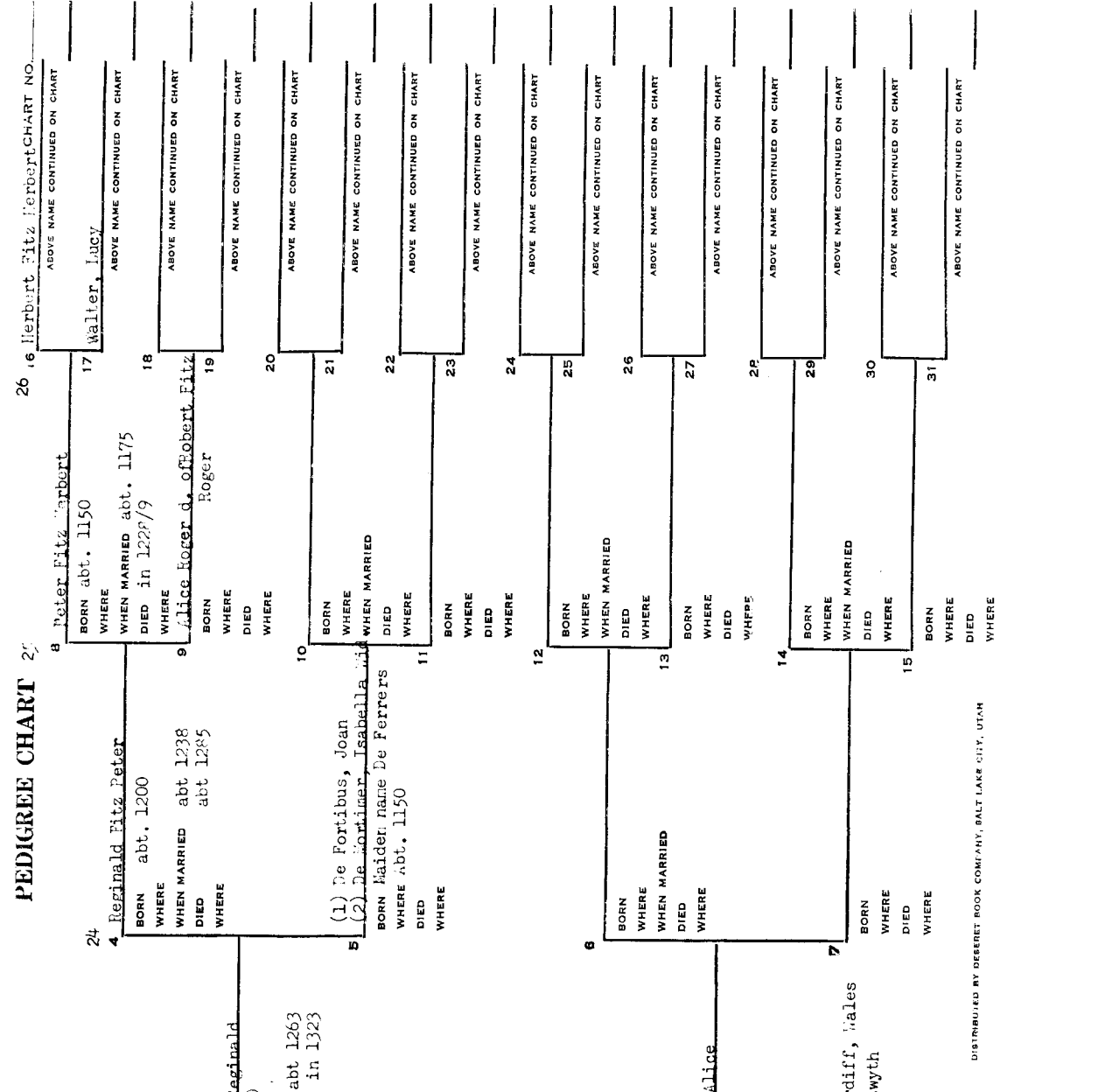
